ABOUT YOUR JUDGES

Miss Jenna Sturrock (Forfarian)

My Mum Sandra always loved dogs but was never allowed one growing up. As as soon as she could have one of her own, she did, and has certainly made up for lost time! Consequently my sister Nicola and I have never known a life without dogs, and in particular our dearest red heads. It was inevitable that we would share her love for the breed which is as strong now as ever.

Mum's first show Irish was a bitch ,Playfield Pearl, joined a few years later by a dog Erinade Thunderbird, I have many happy memories growing up with these two and all of our 'Forfarians' today are descended from them.

Height not being we Scottish gals forte, Junior Handling days started out with Cocker Spaniels. Once I was tall enough and Mum was brave enough, I ventured into the Irish Setter Ring. Although in the breed since my pram days, my first "proper" show dog was Forfarian Goodfella Such a gentle, loveable boy. He gave me a very first and very special RCC when I was 16.

After three years studying to gain my Bachelor's degree in Law And Management, I decided to focus solely on Law. I embarked on my LLB (Hons) degree, graduating with a 1st two years later. I worked in Aberdeen for about a year and then in 2015 I took the opportunity, to work just outside London within an in-house legal counsel, but moved back to Scotland 10 months later.

Currently working as a Senior Legal Analyst for an International Law Firm in Glasgow. for the past two years I have been studying in the evenings for a post graduate degree in the Diploma for Professional Legal Practice. This will allow me to train and qualify as a solicitor in Scotland. I am due to graduate in the summer of 2018.

I started judging the breed in 2008 and have been a Committee member of the Irish Setter Club of Scotland for the past 6 years.

The dog who will always hold a place in my heart is Forfarian Caught You Lookin' JW. The ultimate show girl and a joy to show. So many great memories in and out of the ring and she was very much my girl. She did me proud, gaining two RCCs.

She produced Nolan and Nancy (Sh Ch Forfarian Im Sexy An I Know It JW and Sh Ch Forfarian Hey Sexy Lady JW) and their sister Rhonda (Int Ch Forfarian You Sexy Thing).

It is everyone's dream to make up a champion. To have done so with a brother and sister duo, my twin sister Nicola at the helm with Nancy, has made it extra special. My most memorable moment is winning BOB with Nolan at Crufts 2017. This award at any show is fantastic, but at Crufts with the atmosphere and crowds is something truly amazing. Stepping into the group ring on that famous green carpet with my home bred boy, was a feeling which I will never forget. It was a day which I know made my Mum very proud, so I will treasure it forever. Nolan and Nancy have brought Mum, Nicola and I such fun, joy, excitement and thrills over the last few years. We cannot express how much we love showing them and how grateful we are for the winning they have done.

Living in Scotland with a hobby like dog showing, requires many hours on the road, sadly it leaves little time for anything else! But I'm usually found with my family or friends at weekends or just out with the dogs!

I was brought up with a variety of dogs - my parents showed bulldogs in the 1950's and there were also Pekingese, a Scottish Terrier and Cavaliers as family pets.

I trained as a social worker and worked with children and families for many years, after my marriage in 1977 there were gaps for children and periods when my husband's career took us abroad. We had our first dog, a rescue Golden Retriever, in 1980 and she accompanied us to Norway on assignment for 2 years. She was followed by a pair of littermate Dalmatians - a breed that I still maintain an interest in. We then looked for a smaller breed as we wanted a dog that our young children could be more involved with, and "Toffee" a Welsh Springer Spaniel, joined us and took over as only a WSS can! I was persuaded to show her, with some success, and the die was cast!

in 2002 I went to see an Irish Setter litter with a friend, and a puppy bitch caught my eye and i couldn't resist her - so our first Irish arrived. Highclare Mary Poppins (Poppy) was bred by Gill Tully, and like her namesake, was "practically perfect in every way". We currently share our lives with 5 Irish who are a constant source of pleasure.

I have been lucky enough to make up 3 Show Champions - "Toffee", ShCh Sweet Toffee Apple JW (WSS), "Tia", ShCh Shandwick Star Shine at Teleri JW and "Willow", ShCh Shandwick Love in a Mist for Teleri JW.

I have served on the Committees of Hampshire Gundog Society, South Eastern Welsh Springer Spaniel Club and South of England Irish Setter Club and have been involved with local dog training and ring craft.

I first judged WSS in 1996 and Irish Setters in 2009 and have also judged Dalmatians and English Springer Spaniels.

Most of my time is taken up with our dogs and grandchildren, but I also enjoy gardening when time and weather permit!

I am delighted to have been offered the opportunity to judge the Stakes Classes at the ISAE Open Show and am looking forward to the day.

RULES & REGULATIONS

No other breed of dog will be allowed within the precincts of the show except those permitted by Regulation F(1) 3.55/11

1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees: Members £5.50 first entry per dog; Non Members £7.50 first entry per dog; £1.50 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Catalogues: £2.00 pre-paid with entries (limited number available on the day at £2.50). Membership: UK – Single £11.00; Joint £12.00; Overseas – Single / Joint £15.00. Joining Fee for new Members: £5.00.
6. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **Best in Show:** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Cars on Hot Days.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

17. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
 18. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
 19. All dogs must be brought with a suitable chain and a collar properly fastened to the dog.
 20. All exhibits must be accompanied. The Committee cannot undertake to accept or despatch unaccompanied dogs.
 21. Should any of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entrance fee can be refunded.
 22. Each Judge will be instructed and empowered to withhold any prize in any class, if of the opinion that the dog does not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the Schedule. A Judges decision shall be final except in a case of fraud, or misrepresentation or where a mistake has been made bona fide by the Judge.
 23. An announcement prior to closing of entries in 'Our Dogs' or 'Dog World' of any alterations or additions made by the Committee to the Schedule or to these Regulations, shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.
 24. Parents will be held responsible for the actions and any damage caused by their children within the environs of the show.
 25. The Owner, Exhibitor, Handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club Licensed events, must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
 26. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Anyone failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future shows.
 27. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to them, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of or damage to any dog or person from any cause whatsoever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, Servants, agents or others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
 28. The Officers & Committee of the Irish Setter Association, England cannot accept responsibility for any products advertised or sold by stall holders and/or trade stands at this Show. Exhibitors are reminded that products on sale for the preparation and grooming of dogs may not meet the requirements of the Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F(B).
 29. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
 30. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
 31. The Association reserves to itself the right to refuse entries and all dishonoured cheques will be charged at £10 for subsequent presentations.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Friday, 27th April 2018**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 4 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

THE CHRISTINE HERON MEMORIAL JUNIOR STAKES For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

THE GEOFF COUPE MEMORIAL POST GRADUATE STAKES For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

THE PAT RHODES MEMORIAL OPEN STAKES For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.
