

IRISH SETTER BREED NOTES  
W/C MONDAY 14<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2020

In 1999 Leonard Pagliero judged BIS at Birmingham City and he awarded it to Intrepid. Viv King (Brenrue) was the breed judge and she gave him his 62<sup>nd</sup> CC. Rachel Shaw's Sh Ch Clonageera Flambouyant took the Reserve. Bitches were judged by Ian Hampton who awarded the CC to Sh Ch Carnargus Continuity, this was her 15<sup>th</sup> of 19. Pat and Ken Stockton's 'Georgia', Sh Ch Clonageera Inspiration for Kespas, was Reserve.

Sh Ch Carnbargus Continuity JW was bred and owned by Eve Gardner. She was born in April 1994. Her sire was Sh Ch Shenanagin Stockbroker and her dam was Carnbargus Charisma (a Night Fever daughter).

Her first CC was from Eva Ciechonska at SEISC in 1996 when Sh Ch Kirkavagh Zabara took the Reserve. Later that year at Border Union, Cath McMurrish gave her her second. Sh Ch Laggan Uptown Girl was Reserve. Then at Bournemouth, Sybil Lennox made her up. Ann Aitken's Carbonek Lady Rowena was Reserve.

Her 19<sup>th</sup> and last CC was from Mary Gurney in 2001 at East of England. Sh Ch Kirkavagh Kandy at Muharraq was Reserve. She also won 17 RCCs.

She had two litters: the first to Carnbargus Calvados and the second to Intrepid. This second litter produced Sh Ch Carnbargus Congratulation JW (4 CCs, 6 RCCs).

Continuity's sire, Sh Ch S. Stockbroker was the winner of 16 CCs and 19 RCCs. He was owned and bred by Alister Watt in November 1991 out of Sh Ch Shenanagin Sugar and Spice by Sh Ch Bardonhill Team Spirit At Wynjill J.W.

He sired 26 litters, amongst them Sh Ch Bonahaird White Diamonds, Sh Ch Barleydale Polyantha At Harreds, Sh Ch Dunnygask Verbena, Sh Ch Fetteresk Take That To Shenanagin JW, Sh Ch Maolruadhan Starstruck, Sh Ch Sametsuz Mak'n Mischief and Port Ch Settador Superpaddy.

Sh Ch B. White Diamonds was bred and owned by Mary Bowman out of her Bonahaird After Eight in September 1993. B. After Eight was a daughter of Sh Ch Bonahaird Snowboots, a Sh Ch Erinade Scottish Union daughter. Mary also bred Ir Sh Ch Bonahaird Black Magic who was litter brother to After Eight.

Sh Ch B. Polyantha at Harreds was bred by Sheila and John Vant in January 1996 and owned by Peter Hall. She was out of Sh Ch Barleydale Polgara.

Sh Ch D. Verbena was bred and owned by Ailsa Harvey out of D. Tutti Frutti.

Irene Munro bred Sh Ch F. Take That to S out of her Fearnley Firefantasy.

Sh Ch M. Starstruck was bred and owned by Rita Pickersgill out of Sh Ch Ballywestow Fleet whose litter brother, B Forego, also gained his title.

Magi Henderson bred and owned Sh Ch S. Mak'n Mischief who was out of Sametsuz Hop Scotch.

Ulrike Agne-Draudsin was the owner of Port Ch S. Superpaddy. He was out of Caspians Charity who was Intrepid's litter sister. Charity was owned by Miss E Goodacre and Mr D Livesey.

Between them they won 30 CCs and 25 RCCs.

Richmond Championship show should have taken place this weekend. Carol Bailey (Gwithian), for whom it was a first time appointment, was to have judged.

Carol judged the ISCS in 2017 and made Paula and Phil Lucas's Bardonhill Eternal Flame among Amberlight BIS. He had won Limit. Reserve Best in Show and Best Opposite Sex in Show was Christine Borthwick's Northamber Runs Riot at Lotushill, winner of the Limit Bitch class. Reserve Best Dog in Show was Irene McNeil & Jackie Boyd-McNeil's Gwendariff Gonna Go For Gold, winner of the Yearling Dog and Undergraduate Dog Classes. Reserve Best Bitch was the Graduate Bitch class winner, Mona Hunter & Will Brown's Braidmount Lady in Waiting JW.

Best Puppy in Show was the winner of the Puppy Bitch class, Sametsuz on Reflection (ai) owned by Magi Henderson. Best Puppy Dog in Show was Mrs A Collins and Ian Collins' Lotushill Lionheart. Best Veteran in Show was awarded to Sh.Ch. Lyngor Living Water JW owned and bred by Carolyn Hogsflesh.

Carol owned Sh Ch Covarney Monello JW who was bred by Kate and Gerry Condrin in November 2000. His sire was Sh Ch Thendara Just Lookin' At Stourford and his dam was Covarney California Dream.

'Healey' took his first CC at SCCA in 2005 from Sandy Waterton, the Reserve was Sh Ch Thendara Don Coreleone. Bitches were judged by Frank Kane and his winners were Summergate Making Magic, her second, and Bluebyeyou Mystic Shiraz, her third RCC.

His second came from David Laidlaw in 2006 at ISBC, Reserve going to Sh Ch Scotselaw Jackson at Lynwood. Julie Hawkins was the bitch judge and she found her CC winners in Sh Ch Glennara Fleur De Mai, her third, and Reddins Bobbin, her second RCC.

His title came at Driffield in 2007 when Richard Bott was the judge. Sh Ch Sumaric Shadow of Mr Jingles was Reserve. Richard also did the bitches and his CC winner was Sh Ch Braidmount Geisha Girl, her 11<sup>th</sup> of 28, and Bardonhil Days are Diamond, her first RCC.

He also picked up 5 RCCs from Roy Rout, Steve Chapman, Colin Waddell, Brian Marshall and Brian Limpus.

Not since 1934 has an Irish Setter been Best in Show at Richmond. Sh Ch Nutbrown Sorrel was owned by Joe Braddon and bred Miss Manuelle in February 1932 by Golden Dawn of Gadeland out of Nutbrown Tessa. She was first in Limit Bitch at Crufts in 1934, second in Open, first in Restricted Limit dogs and bitches, second in Restricted Open dogs and bitches and took the RCC. The judge was Mr J A Carbery. Eileen Walker's Ch. Hartsbourne Vanity won the CC. Born in February 1930 she was by Rheola Benedict ex Hartsbourne Jewel and was BOB.

In dogs, Mrs. E M Baker's Ch Son of a Gun of Gadeland won the CC. He was by Shamus of Ballyshannon ex Ch Gadeland of Ballyshannon. RCC was Mrs A Morse's Croftdown Colin (Ambrose O'Murrell ex Wanluss O'Vasterne)

In 1936 Sorrel went one better under Mr P J O'Callaghan when she was first in Open Bitch, CC and BOB. RBCC was Mrs. E. M. Baker's Ch Rebel Maid of Gadeland; she was by Rheola Boniface out of Bidy of Gadeland.

Croftdown Colin went one better too by taking the Dog CC. He was born in July 1931. RDCC was Mrs E M Baker's Royalist of Gadeland. He was by the previous year's DCC winner Ch Son of a Gun of Gadeland out of the previous year's RCC winner Ch Rebel Maid of Gadeland.

It seems that MLM and I don't often go to Richmond mostly because when she was working it usually fell at the beginning of term and it is also around the time of her birthday when me and the dogs have to take second place to her family.

One year we definitely went was 2001 when she first gave tickets. She judged the Dogs and awarded the CC to Sh Ch Shenanagin Some Might Say its Bardonhill, his 4<sup>th</sup> of 14, and a first RCC to Shandwick Amethyst at Ferndel who went on to win 7 CCs and 8 RCCs.

It was her birthday last week and as she stated on FB 'it was an interesting day.'
